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that electronically? 5 MS. PENNY: Thank you so much. Okay, great. Next we have a report from the 6 7 actuary, Ms. Sherry Chan. 8 MS. CHAN: Thank you, Ms. Chair. 9 are two fiscal notes and believe it or not, 10 the legislative session is obviously underway 11 and they have moved up the legislative session 12 to accommodate the primaries so the fiscal 13 notes have fallen through. So there is two 14 that pertains to TRS that was issued since the 15 legislative session began. 16 The first one has to do with the basket 17 clause that we had talked about. This board 18 had voted on to increase the foreign equity 19 securities cap from 10 percent to 20 percent. 20 So the bill was drafted and fiscal note was 21 completed. There is no cost for that 22 legislative bill if it was to be passed. 23 the second fiscal note has to do with the 24 retiree Ms. Cynthia Falletta who is currently 25 a Tier 4 retiree. And the legislative bill 0006 1 Proceedings 2 would have her be reclassified as Tier 1 and 3 have her pension benefit recalculated. So the increase is about 16,000 dollars or so on an 5 annual basis, and on the present value it 6 would be 318,000 total and because she is 7 retired, that would be if the legislative bill 8 was passed that 318,000 would be reflected all 9 at one time in one contribution immediately. 10 MS. PENNY: Thank you. Okay. Executive 11 director's report given by Thad McTigue. MR. McTIGUE: Thank you. It has been 12 13 suggested that the next regular meeting of the 14 Teachers' Retirement Board be held on the 15 third Thursday of the month, March 19, 2020. 16 Please mark your calendars. 17 Item number 2 is the revised asset allocation policy.
