2	MS. REILLY: Good afternoon. Welcome to
3	the March 19, 2020 TRS board meeting. I am
4	going to start by calling the roll.
5	John Adler?
6	MR. ADLER: I am here.
7	MS. REILLY: Thomas Brown?
8	MR. BROWN: I am here.
9	MS. REILLY: Natalie Green-Giles?
10	MS. GREEN-GILES: I am here as well.
11	MS. REILLY: David Kazansky?
12	MR. KAZANSKY: Present.
13	MS. REILLY: Russell Buckley?
14	MR. BUCKLEY: Here for Lindsey Oates,
15	DOE CFO.
16	MS. REILLY: Debra Penny?
17	MS. PENNY: Here.

20	MS. REILLY: We have a quorum. So next
21	on the agenda is a report from the actuary. I
22	will turn it over to Sherry.
23	MS. CHAN: Thank you, Patricia.
24	Hopefully everybody can hear me. If not I
2.5	quess wave.

2	So the first item on my agenda is the
3	preliminary contributions for the next fiscal
4	year that starts in about three months. The
5	contribution calculator for the next fiscal
6	year is approximately 3.5 billion dollars.
7	This does represent a decrease in
8	contributions of about 234 million. This was
9	due to the item that I had discussed
10	previously at a previous board meeting
11	concerning the change in the valuation
12	methodology for the TDA actual valuation
13	method. So there is a resolution in the back
14	of my memo that I request the Board to take a
15	look at, and I will be happy to answer any
16	questions that anybody might have. Okay?
17	MR. KAZANSKY: No questions.
18	MS. CHAN: I will go on to the next
19	question, which is Chapter 41 of the Laws of
20	2016. Just a reminder to everybody, this law
21	was passed in 2016, and it allows members to
22	purchase their past military service
23	regardless of when or where the military
24	service was performed, and employees and
2.5	members can purchase up to three years and

2	they pay a portion of it as well as the
3	retirement system and the employer will pay
4	mostly the City in this case will pay the
5	remainder.
6	So for Fiscal Year '19, which is what
7	part of this calculation is for there were
8	25 employees that purchased service for a
9	total of 42 years. After deducting out the
10	members' cost, the amount was 668,000 dollars.
11	This represents the amount that the City
12	already has paid or the employer already has
13	paid into TRS, and this resolution is for
14	directing the executive director of TRS to go
15	to the State to ask for this reimbursement
16	amount.
17	So just to give you guys some additional
18	numbers also since 2016, which was when this
19	law was passed, cumulatively this represents 5
20	million dollars that the employers have paid
21	into TRS already for this purchase of service
22	that we are waiting for the State to
23	reimburse. I will just see if there are any
24	questions from anybody.
25	Hearing none, I will move on to my last

2	agenda item for public session, which is the
3	fiscal note report. There was one fiscal note
4	that was issued since the last time that we
5	met. This one fiscal note has to do with
6	being able to also purchase military service
7	for those other than those honorably
8	discharged and this because we do not have the
9	data for Chapter 41 purchases of the benchmark
10	to see how many people would purchase their
11	service if allowed, so we calculated this on a
12	per-person basis just to give those reading
13	the bill an idea if this list passed how much
14	it would cost.
15	The contributions were calculated to be
16	approximately 5,100 dollars for each member
17	that purchased service, but the years of
18	service that was assumed was 2.5 years. The
19	past data Chapter 41 we did see approximately
20	two and a half years being purchased by each
21	member, so the 5,100 dollars represents a
22	per-person basis based on if they purchase two
23	and a half years, and that's a
24	contribution-dollar basis. So if there are no

questions, that's the end of my report.
